



Loropetalum 'Burgundy'

An attractive evergreen shrub with deep burgundy, wine foliage which forms an elegant arching habit as the plant matures. In spring and summer dark pink flowers appear, which makes it a stunning contrast shrub when planted with other green foliage plants.

Loropetalum Burgundy trimmed into a topiary and planted in a stylish pot makes a fashion statement in any outdoor setting.

Where to Grow

Loropetalum 'Burgundy' prefers to be planted in a sunny or semi-shaded position with good drainage.

This attractive shrub has a wide range of uses in the garden including:

- Topiary specimens planted in containers
- Mixed garden beds
- Formal garden plantings
- Backdrop or accent plant
- Loropetalum 'Burgundy' grows up to 2m high by 2.5m wide.

Planting

- Plant either in the garden or containers from early Autumn to early Summer
- Planted in the garden Loropetalum 'Burgundy' requires well drained soil.
- When planting in the garden add compost into the planting hole
- If planting in containers, use a good container mix containing a slow release fertilizer, ensure that the container has good drainage.
- Cold tolerant

Care

- Water well while the plant is establishing itself.
- If planted in containers monitor and water regularly, do not allow to dry out.
- To maintain a topiary effect, trim lightly after flowering.
- Feed occasionally with a slow release fertilizer.
- To encourage new growth and keep a tidy habit trim to shape early spring and when flowers have finished.
